Director of Music Report November Meeting 2021

It's nice to be able to report something different for a change. As of the 26th October the Concert band was able to resume full rehearsals at the Senior Citizens Centre. We must be constantly aware of the risk that Covid still poses in Australia and ensure that every precaution is taken for the safety of our members.

Unfortunately, due to Government imposed restrictions, we are unable to operate our COS ensemble at this time or allow non-vaccinated members to attend rehearsals, I trust this will change as soon as possible and once again we can run full ensembles.

Almost as soon as the restrictions lifted we have been able to confirm a number of engagements before the end of the year, including, Remembrance Day, Carols functions and a performance in the main street, it bodes well for the resumption of "normal" gigs in the new year.

Musically it will take some time and effort to regain the performance standard and confidence that the band showed prior to the commencement of lockdown but I have every confidence that we will overcome any hurdles that this may present.

Also, Musically, I believe the road forward will occur in three stages:

1. General playing and getting used to playing in an ensemble
2. Reclaiming and resumption of regular gigs in our community
3. Developing our skills in longer term projects that can take our band further afield.
